For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Our combined Report Indicates there has been a decline to the number of students being advanced or proficient as a whole on the ELA M-Step assessment. In addition there is a significant gap between ethnic groups and the proficiency rate on the assessments. In order to accelerate student achievement and close the gaps, Chester Miller integrates ELA with science and social studies texts. Additionally, We will continue to follow the MTSS model to aid our students in meeting proficiency in all areas. Professional Learning Communities will allow for the review of data and the adjustment of instructional delivery to assist students in mastering content that

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF OUR SCHOOL

Chester Miller Elementary is a Kindergarten through Sixth grade school that borders Saginaw Township on the southwest edge of the city. Chester Miller has a diverse population of 308 students. There are 16 teachers on staff, including 1 special education resource teacher, two Title 1 teachers, two academic interventionists, 1 secretary and a truancy abatement clerk. The average daily attendance was approximately 88%. We also have one DHHS worker housed in the building through the Pathways to Potential Program. There is also a certified mental health therapist that works in the building as well. Chester Miller provides many opportunities for parent and community involvement. A review of M-STEP scores indicate that we must work to increase achievement in all core subjects.

CORE CURRICULUM

The Michigan School Code requires every local school district to establish a core curriculum and an aligned instructional program. Teachers, instructional coaches and administrators have collaborated to address core curriculum requirements by creating overarching questions and essential learning expectations for students, along with assessments and resources for four core content areas (English, Social Studies, Science and Math).
